

#### **Children and Families**

Childcare for infants and children ages 2 and younger is available in the church nursery during our Sunday morning services. Pagers are used to contact parents during the worship services when necessary.

### **Sunday Worship Services**

9:00 am Nursery care is available for children age 2 years and younger.

**10:15 a.m.** Children in pre-school through grade 5 will be invited to leave for Sunday School, and Middle School students will be invited to attend Bibles & Bagels, following the *Message for Children*. All children in grades 3 and up will be invited to remain in worship with their families on the first Sunday of the month. Nursery care is available for children ages 2 and younger every Sunday.

# Opportunity to Give and Serve


#### **Homeless Solutions Coordinator**

Acknowledgment of the Oak Tree's prognosis has brought with it the clear recognition of the numerous responsibilities that we have before us.
