Nursery Care

Our warm and loving Nursery is staffed for our 10:15 a.m. worship service with two child care providers caring for children, infants through age 2. Parents may leave their children while they attend worship in the Sanctuary. The worship service will be live streamed into the Nursery for parents who wish to stay with their children and watch the service. During the 9 a.m. worship service, the Nursery is available as a parents' room. Please speak with our Director of Ministry to Children and their Families, Stacy Currie, if you have any questions or to find out more about our ministry to children.

Sunday School

At the 10:15 a.m. worship service after the *Message for Children*, children ages 3 through grade 5 may go to Sunday School, and Middle School Students may go to Bibles & Bagels in the Church House Library. On the first Sunday of the month, children in grades 3–middle school remain in worship for the full hour.


