We are excited to announce that it is time to sign up for this summer’s Workcamp in Pemaquid, Maine, where we will stay at the Carpenter’s Boat Shop. For many years, Workcamp has provided our Senior High students with life changing experiences, as we help the local community by repairing and maintaining houses (painting, roofing, siding, etc.). As we grow together in fellowship, these priceless experiences remind us of what it truly means to be a loving servant of God, living out the core purpose of our Youth & Young Adult Ministry at BRPC:

“To nurture in our young people a strong faith in and love toward Christ, providing an experience of Christian community where each person is welcomed and accepted, and to create Spirit-filled opportunities to put faith into action by serving our neighbors in need.”

WORKCAMP DATES: Saturday, July 13 (leave Basking Ridge at 8 am) and return on Sunday, July 21 (about 9 pm).

Packing List for Workcamp 2019

In General

- Pack lightly! There is limited space on the bus.
- Label ALL your belongings
- Duffel bags or soft luggage is preferred over hard cases (due to limited space on bus)

Personal Items – one change of clothes per day (max)

- Toiletries/ Clothes** - Casual, but nicer clothes for Sunday church & for Dinner on Wednesday w/ the Mainers, sweatshirt, rain clothes, sleeping attire, and **at least 1 pair of work pants/jeans (required)**
- Sunglasses/Hat**
- 2 Swimsuits, 2 Towels and Shoes** for bathing (Old sneakers, Water shoes, flip-flops, crocs, etc.)
- Sturdy shoes for the worksites** (Work boots STRONGLY preferred; NO flip-flops or sandals)
- Sneakers** for non-work times
- Sleeping bag, pillow, pad/air mattress** (please only bring twin-size air mattress unless you plan to share with someone else. There is limited room in the sleeping areas)
- 100% Biodegradable soap & shampoo/ conditioner** (Doc Bronner's, etc.)
- Sunscreen and bug spray (VERY important!)**
- Flashlight or headlight** (good for bathroom runs at night)
- \$200? - Spending money** (4 meals on road, med. insurance copays in case of emergency, 1 lunch, souvenirs, misc.)
- Refillable LARGE Water Bottle (VERY important!)** with name clearly marked – not throw away
- Prescription medicines as needed** – labeled with name and dosage amounts
- Phone charger** – plan to use phone minimally – we want to be in community with those present
